

NAVARINO NATURE CENTER (NNC) is located in the southeastern section of Shawano County, within the 15,000 acre Navarino Wildlife Area (WDNR).

NNC leases a 40 acre portion of land within the Navarino Wildlife Area. Located at the nature center is a picnic area, picnic shelter, amphitheater, rustic restrooms, pump well, parking lot, cabin and an all-season handicap accessible, educational building.

NNC went "Green" with the addition of Solar Panels and Geo-thermal for a more eco-friendly way to use energy. Our programs are designed to provide visitors with an opportunity to view nature first hand and to experience the curiosity of discovery. Programs and activities are available for visitors of all ages and capabilities.



Special Limitation Opportunities: Trolley Rides (1-2 hours approx.)

View migrating waterfowl, wildlife, and scenery on a wagon ride through the Navarino Wildlife Area. Along the way the wagon will make various stops to talk about items of interest at those areas. Tours

are available focusing on a variety of topics: Bird watching, prairies, fall colors, forest management, and many other viewing opportunities.

Cost: \$10 per person (Minimum 15- Max. 30 people)

Requires at least two weeks notice to confirm availability of equipment.

Available only during May - October.
